Outreach: 2016 in Review

Dear reader,

2016 was a year to remember at SomaliCAN. The organization provided much needed information, services and resources to a large number of Somali community members, service providers and policymakers.

Services ranged from hosting the annual Somali Graduation and Scholarship Dinner where 15 deserving Somali high school graduates were awarded scholarship money to providing cultural sensitivity training to medical trainees at the Ohio State University's Nisonger Center of Excellence for Developmental Disabilities.

Above all else, the publication of 12 editions of the SomaliCAN Outreach Newsletter, including this December edition of the bilingual publication, added much value to raising awareness in the Somali community and bringing barriers faced by non-English speaking parents with children with developmental disabilities in Ohio. SomaliCAN is grateful for the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council for the continuing support for this important community resource.

The goal of the SomaliCAN Outreach Newsletter is to make the Somali community aware of policies and common practices that insensitive towards people with developmental disabilities and their families and to highlight information on resources employment prospects and stories regarding culturally competent services via a newsletter. Through the newsletter, SomaliCAN conducts outreach activities to identify individuals with developmental disabilities their families within the and underserved Somali community who otherwise might not come to the attention of policymakers and assist and enable the individuals and families to obtain services, individualized supports, and other forms of assistance, including access to information, services and resources in their own Somali language.

A second goal is to educate policymakers and service providers about the needs and aspirations of the growing Somali community in Ohio so as to make their services more responsive to the needs of this community.

The newsletter is a monthly electronic publication sponsored by SomaliCAN in partnership with the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council. This project has been successfully reaching the Somali population since 2009 and providing them with relevant information regarding disability related services.

Every month, the SomaliCAN Outreach Newsletter is published using the DD Council color scheme and includes the term Outreach in the title of the newsletter. Articles in the newsletter are conveyed in both Somali and English in order to make it accessible for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families, community members, policymakers and the general public.

When the newsletter was first launched in 2009, the large Somali community in Ohio did not have access to reliable information on available resources on developmental disabilities.

In fact, there was huge stigma associated with developmental disabilities and parents tended to hide their children from the public eye in order to avoid the social stigma. Thanks to the sustained efforts of community advocates, there is significant progress that has been made over the years. Parents of children with developmental disabilities meet regularly with specialists in the various areas of developmental disabilities and exchange ideas and information. Healthcare providers are also more aware of the needs and challenges faced by Somali individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.

A lot of progress has been made in many fronts. Somali professionals specializing in speech language pathology, nursing, social work, psychology, medicine and other areas that will greatly reduce the disparities faced by this community are in the pipelines. The situation has improved and it will continue to improve when all these resources become available. In the meantime, individuals with developmental disabilities and their families as well as caregivers have relied on information from the SomaliCAN Outreach Newsletter. We are exploring ways to continue the publication to improve the living conditions and promote access to appropriate care and resources for Somalis with developmental disabilities and their families. *Ends*

Wargeysku wuxuu u adeegayay bulshada Soomaaliyeed ee reer Ohio tan iyo sanadkii 2009 iyada oo bulshada loogu diyaarinayay warbixino ku saabsan adeegyada iyo wararka ku saabsan curyaannimada.

Bil walba waxaa wargeyska lagu daabacaa midabka Golaha Curyaannimada Korriinka Ohio iyo sida ay golohu u door bidaan. Qormooyinka wargeyska waxaa lagu faafiyaa af Soomaali iyo Ingiriis labadaba si ay u fahmaan dadka qaba curyaannimada, qoysaskooda, bulshada Soomaaliyeed, Madaxda iyo dadweynaha oo dhan.

Markii la daah furay wargeyska sanadkii 2009, ma lahayn meel ay bulshada ballaaran ee Soomaaliyeed ee Ohio ay ka heli karaan warbixino waafi ah oo ku saabsan adeegyada ka jira degaanka.

Autism Online Training Program

ASD Strategies in Action, an online training program aimed at improving the lives of individuals with autism and their families, launched January 18th.

This program, which is free to all Ohioans, offers information and skills to help families and providers better support individuals on the autism spectrum.

The program has two levels:

Many Faces of Autism will introduce you to characteristics of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and dispel common misconceptions through the experiences and perspectives of individuals on the autism spectrum. It takes about 90 minutes to omplete.

The second level of modules is broken out by age range, and presents evidence-based strategies in action at home, school and community environments. Each section offers voluntary certification.

Somali Interpreter

The Waxner Medical Center at the Ohio State University

Job Description:

This is a temporary position and is not benefit eligible. This job requires 20-25 hours per week. This position serves as an interpreter utilized by the staff at the Ohio State University Medical Center to more fully meet the needs of the LEP patients seeking health care services. Patient volume fluctuates, as do the needs of the region, country, and dialogue of the LEP population served. As these fluctuations are unpredictable the flexibility of this person allows the medical Center to maintain a staff of highly trained medically specialized, interpreters that can most closely support the needs of the patients. This position will facilitate support services for inpatient and outpatient activity of patients of the Ohio State University Medical Center. This position must provide culturally competent care to patients, and act as the benchmark for staff on cultural areas of importance when caring for these patients.

Requirements:

Need prior medical interpreter experience. Desire 2-4 year degree in language interpreting for, linguistic degree and/or in a medical clinical field. Prefer completion of 40-hour medical interpreter training program, internship, and completion of national certification exam for medical interpreters. We will conduct a language proficiency test: code of ethics, standard practices, and medical terminology. Other skills required are: customer service; ability to collaborate with a variety of individuals across the organization; and, highly refined interpersonal, conflict resolution, problem solving, writing and verbal communication skills. Need ability to translate non-medical into the language qualified for. Must be a licensed driver.
