

Author's Biography: Dr. Hawa Abdi

DR. HAWA ADBI DIBLAAWE

Dr Hawa Abdi Diblaawe was born in 1947 in Mogadishu. Her father was a worker in the city's port and her mother died when she was very young. As the eldest child, Hawa was forced to raise her four sisters in conditions of poverty. But she never lost hope sight of her dreams.

"My father was an educated man," she recalls, "He made sure I had the chance to become a doctor."

With the help of a Soviet scholarship, Hawa studied medicine in Kiev and soon became Somalia's first female gynecologist. She then completed a Law degree at the Somali National University in Mogadishu, where she later became an Assistant Professor of Medicine. She soon opened a clinic on her family's ancestral land in the Afgooye Corridor, using the profits from her family land to provide free health care to all of her countrymen.

When the civil war began in 1991, Dr. Hawa started housing her employees on her land, feeding them and caring for them. Soon their friends and relatives came seeking shelter, then after the friends and relatives of their friends and relatives. Dr. Hawa welcome them all, providing shelter to all those who came regardless of where they came from. In 2012, Dr. Hawa's land housed more than 90,000 refugees, most of whom are women and children.

Today, Dr. Hawa Abdi continues to fighte for the women, children and elderly people of the Hawa Abdi Village. With the help of her two amazing daughters, Dego and Amina, both of whom are doctors who have followed in her footsteps, Dr. Hawa continues to keep a candle of light lit for the people of the Afgooye Corridor.

Dr. Hawa has won numerous distinctions and awards, including the John Jay Justice Award, Vital Voices' Women of the Year Award and a nomination for the Noble Peace Prize in 2012. U.S Secretary of State Hillary Clinton has called Dr Abdi "a perfect example of the kind of woman who inspires me".

Dr Xaawo Cabdi Dhiblaawe waxay 1949kii ku dhalatay magaalada Muqdisho. Aabbaheed wuxuu shaqaale ka ahaa dekadda hooyadeedna waxay dhimatay iyada oo aad u yar. Maadaama ay curad ahayd, Xaawo waxaa khasab ku noqotay inay gabdhood saboolnimo ku koriso afartii walaalaheed ahaa. Hase yeeshee, kama aysan rajo dhigin riyadeeda.

"Aabbahay wuxuu ahaa nin aqoon leh," ayay xasuusataa, "Wuxuu xaqiijiyay inaan helo fursad aan dhakhtar ku noqdo."

Deeq waxbarasho oo ay Midowgii Soofiyeeti ka heshay awgeed, Xaawo waxay caafimaadka ku baratay Kiev waxayna dhakhtarkii dumarka ee haweeney ah dalka Soomaaliya.

Kadib, waxay shahaadada sharciga ka qaadatay Jaamacadda Ummadda Soomaaliyeed ee Muqdisho, halkaasoo ay kadib ka noqotay bare sare oo caafimaadka ah. Isla markiiba waxay ka furatay rug caafimaad dhulkii qoyskeeda oo ku yaallay Aagga Afgooye, iyadoo u isticmaalaysa faa'iidada dhulka reerkeedana inay dadka dalkeeda u samayso adeeg caafimaad oo bilaash ah.

Markii dagaalka sokeeye billowday 1991, Dr. Xaawo waxay bilowday inay hoy ka siiso shaqaalaheeda dhulkeedii, iyadoo quudinaysa oo daryeelaysa. Durba asxaabtooda iyo qaraabadooda ayaa soo doontay hoy, ka dibna waxa asxaabtii iyo qaraabadii ka daba yimid kuwo kale.

Dr. Xaawo way soo dhowaysay dhammaantood iyadoo hoy siisay dhammaan dadkii u yimid iyadoon eegayn halka ay ka yimaadeen. Sannadkii 2012, Dr. Xaawo dhulkeedu wuxuu hoy u ahaa qaxooti 90,000 oo qof ka badan, oo intooda badan ay haween iyo carruur yihiin.

Maanta, Dr. Xaawo Cabdi waxay sii waddaa inay u halganto haweenka, carruurta iyo dadka waayeelka ah ee ku sugan Tuulada Xaawo Cabdi. Iyadoo kaashanaysa labadeeda gabdhood ee fariidyada ah, Deeqo iyo Aamina, oo labaduba dhakhaatiir raadkeeda raacay ah, Dr. Xaawo waxay sii joogtaynaysaa inay iftiimiso shumaca u bidhaamaya dadka Aagga Afgooye.

Dr. Xaawo waxay ku guulaysatay aqoonsiyo iyo abaalgudyo ay ka mid yihiin billadda John Jay Justice Award, Vital Voices Woman of the Year Award, iyo iyadoo loo sharraxay billadda Noble Peace Prize sannadkii 2012. Xoghayaha Arrimaha Maraykanka Hillary Clinton ayaa ku magacawday Dr. Xaawo Cabdi "tusaale ku habboon nooca haweenka aan ku daydo."

About the Shuraako Program

Shuraako's objective is to identify businesses and other initiatives that create jobs in Somalia. That information is compiled on an international website (www.shuraako.org), which was launched in September 2012. The Shuraako program is about connections: We act as a neutral broker to help connect you to potential partners, businesses, markets, suppliers, technical assistance, and other investors and donors working in Somalia

Primary Job Responsibility

The Shuraako program is seeking to hire an area business development specialist located in Mogadishu, and responsible for the area in and around Mogadishu. The area business development specialist will be the professional point of contact for the Shuraako program in and around Mogadishu. He/she will conduct research and compile information on existing businesses in the region, as well as those businesses' requirements for investment and technical assistance, and locate and map local businesses based on the Shuraako program criteria. The Business development specialist will also be responsible for regularly updating the Shuraako team on all relevant business developments in and around Mogadishu.

Essential Job Duties

- Identify investment options within existing businesses and/or potential businesses that are most feasible for potential investors to invest in based on scalability, repetition, job creation, profitability, and sustainability of the business.
- Be the "on-the-ground" eyes, ears, and voice for Shuraako program in and around Mogadishu.
- Identify local business needs such as technical assistance, access to markets, networks, credit, business knowledge, business mentoring, etc.
- Promote the Shuraako program by building relationships with the business community, business associations, civil society, and government. (i.e. "Chamber of Commerce")
- Assist investment opportunities with standardized investment applications, preparing in-depth reviews of relevant financial information and documentation.
- Assist Shuraako team to provide post-funding/post investment technical assistance to partners.
- Regularly update Shuraako team about business investment opportunities progress and challenges.
- Travel in and around Mogadishu area, cities, and villages to conduct site visits to investment opportunities.
- Collect data and information related to private sector development and job creation in and around Mogadishu.
- Identify Somali and non-Somali investors who have invested in local businesses.
- Complete weekly activity reports and submit to the Program Director by email.
- Participate in weekly meetings with the Program Director via Skype.
- Perform other related activities as required in order to ensure Shuraako program success.
- Assist with monitoring Shuraako-supported projects
- Comply with Shuraako project regulations and commitment to One Earth Future's Vision (www.oneearthfuture.org) and Shuraako's Goals (www.shuraako.org).

- Must be a current resident of at least 5 to 10 years in and around Mogadishu
- Must be able to travel in and out of Somalia, as well as to North America and Europe
- Bachelor's degree in Business, Finance, Economics, or other related field.
- At least 7 years of relevant work experience, including in the areas of business development and/or sales. An entrepreneurial-minded individual a must!
- Demonstrated networking and outreach skills within different sectors (business, government, and civil society).
- An extensive network of relationships within the business community in and around Mogadishu (ideally business, government and civil society) strongly preferred.
- Fluency in Somali and English is required; Skills in another language, a plus.
- Computer skills experience and knowledge of computer operations, knowledge of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, etc.).
