# The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Ohio Somali Graduation Program

Somali Education Minister Joins SomaliCAN in Honoring Graduates in Ohio- Event Pictures

SomaliCAN- Somalia's Minister for Education, Heritage & Higher Education, Dr. Abdinur Mohamud honored hundreds of Somali students who graduated from Ohio high schools and colleges at the Second Annual Ohio Somali Graduation Ceremony held at the Ballroom of the Hilton Hotel in Columbus, Ohio. Mr. Jibril Mohamed, President of SomaliCAN and Mr. Sahid Ali, ESL Coordinator for Columbus Schools were the Masters of Ceremony for the program.

The event is organized annually by SomaliCAN, an outreach and advocacy organization based in Ohio and the Somali Education Association, a resource education for educators, parents, and students in the United States. Six of the graduates were awarded scholarships by the Law Office of Russell Flickinger while two more scholarships were awarded by the Ohio State University-Marion.

Columbus Mayor Michael Coleman, Columbus Schools Superintendent Dr. Gene Harris, leadership of Westerville Schools, representatives from the Ohio State University, Columbus State Community College, and local, county, state, and federal government representatives participated in the event to recognize the academic achievement of Somali graduates.

Presidential Service Awards from the White House were presented to two educators- Mr. Sahid Ali of the Columbus City Schools, and Abdikarim Gole who teaches the Somali languages at the Ohio State University. The Presidential Award is the highest honor given to American Citizens who show exceptional commitment to service and bears the signature of the United States President, Barack Obama.

Recognitions from federal, state, and local governments were presented to SomaliCAN and its staff. U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown, U.S. Congressman Pat Tiberi, Ohio Governor John Kasich, Columbus Mayor Michael Coleman, and other elected and appointed officials recognized the event and proclaimed the third week of June as the Somali Graduation Week.

Renowned Somali leaders who spoke to the graduates included Ali Mire Awale, the composer of the Somali National Anthem, Dr. Abdisalan Sheikh Hussein, former Minister for Higher Education in Somalia as well as his deputy, Dr. Yussuf Columbus.

Education Minister Dr. Abdinur Sheikh Mohamed emphasized the importance of education and encouraged graduates to sustain their effort until they attain higher education. "It takes two educated parents to raise a functioning family in America" he said. The minister traveled from Somalia in order to show his support for more than 300 Somali students who graduated from Ohio schools and colleges in 2011.

#### RISING DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY RATES. NATURAL DIETS SHOW PROMISE

## Naafannimada Koritaaneed, Xaddi Sare Kac ah Ku Yimid iyo Cuntada Dabiiciga ah oo Naallo Muujinaysa

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has recently conducted a study which aimed at analyzing the evolution of developmental disability rates among American children, over a period of 11 years, from 1997 to 2008.

The study noted a steady increase in the prevalence of these disorders: while about 12.8% of American children suffered from some form of developmental disability in the 1997-1999 period, that figure grew to 15% in the period between 2006 and 2008, which translates to roughly ten million affected US children. Some parents taking matters into their own hands, choosing the natural route with their children, including protocols like a raw food diet, have reversed autism and other disorders in some reported cases.

This staggering increase in diagnosis has led Dr. Coleen Boyle, head of the National Center on Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities at CDC, to declare that the research is merely pointing out a health issue that needs to be addressed, and that "Children are our future, and many of these children can grow up to be very productive citizens, so we need to invest in programs to help facilitate their development." The study reveals the fact that ADHD and autism are the leading disorders to have increased in prevalence among young children.

While autism diagnoses have jumped 0.19% in the 2006-2008 period, when compared to 1997-1999, and ADHD diagnoses have risen from 5.7 to 7.6 between the aforementioned reference periods, a number of other developmental disorders that could be controlled or reversed are also affecting children.

Dr. Boyle's study has taken note of various intellectual disabilities, learning disorders, seizures, cerebral palsy, along with other impairing conditions that have plagued children in the 1997-2008 time span, according to parental reports.

Cilmi-baaristaasi waxay muujisay kicitaan joogto ah oo dhinaca ku dhicidda jirrooyinkaas ah: iyadoo ilaa iyo 12.8% oo carruurta Maraykanka ahi ay la ildarraanayeen cayn ka mid ah naafannimada koritaaneed intii u dhexaysay 1997-1999, lambarkaasi wuxuu gaaray 15% muddadii u dhexaysay 2006 iyo 2008, taasi oo uu micnaheedu yahay in ilaa toban milyan oo carruur Maraykan ahi ay cudurradani haleeleen. Waaliddiinta qar ayaa hawshooda iyagu qabsaday oo carruurtooda u doorbiday dariiq dabiici ah, sida hannaanno ay ka mid yihiin cuntada ceeriin, taasina waxay marar la soo sheegay caabbisay gotomiska iyo jirrooyinka kale.

Kordhidda xad-dhaafka ah ee cudur-ka-helidda dhinacaas ah ayaa ku sababtay Dr. Coleen Boyle, Qaranka ee Dhalashooyinka madaxa Xarunta Kharriban iyo Naafannimada Koritaaneed ee CDC, in ay tilmaanto in ay cilmibaaristu muujinayso in ay jirto dhibaato caafimaad oo ay tahay in la waajaho, iyo in ay "Carruurtu yihiin musqtaqbalkeenna, qaar ka mid ah carruurtaana waxay noqon karaan muwaddiniin waxsoo-saar leh markay koraan, waxay marka tahay in aannu maalgelinno barnaamijyo aannu ku sahalno koritaankooda." Cilmi-baaristu waxay daaha ka rogaysaa xaqiiqada ah in ay ADHD iyo qotomisku yihiin jirrooyinka ugu horreeya eek u dhiciddoodu ay carruurta yaryar ku korodhay.

Meesha ay aqoonsashada qotomisku korodhay 0.19% muddadii 2006-2008, markii la barbardhigo 1997-1999, ADHD aqoonsigiisu wuxuu ka kacay min 5.7 ilaa 7.6 intii u dhexaysay waqtiga tixraaca eek or ku xusan, tiro kale oo jirrooyin koritaaneed ah oo la xakamayn karo ama la caabbin karo ayaa iyaguna carruurta saamayn ku haya.

# Developmental Disabilities: Continued Naafanimada Koritaaneed: Sii akhri

The exact causes of these deficiencies are still the subject of much debate, as the scientific community has yet to reach a consensus. Although there are clear indicators that autism, for example, has a strong genetic basis, numerous factors such as inadequate nutrition, heavy metal poisoning, prenatal exposure to toxic substances, pesticides and drug use are as possible This lack of scientific consensus, as well as the ambiguity surrounding the nature of autism and its many forms, has proven to be a fertile ground for numerous controversial hypotheses. The most important of them claims that there is a positive correlation between the onset of autism and the vaccinations toddlers undergo as part of standard immunization against hepatitis, polio and other infectious diseases.

While the medical community dismisses these claims and recommends the use of medication to target the symptoms of autism, numerous live examples have proven that embracing a healthy, natural way of life based on a raw diet that aims to strengthen the gut flora, aid immunity and detoxify the system, can prevent, and in some cases, even reverse autism in its early stages.

La'aanshaan waxa cilmiyeed oo laysku raacay, iyo weliba ogaal-li'ida ku xayn-daaban dabiicadda qotomiska iyo noocyadiisa badan, ayaa waxay soo jiiteen dhawr ixtimaal oo uu muran badani ka jiro. Kan ugu muhiimsan sheegashooyinkaasi waa in uu jiro xiriir muuqda oo u dhexeeya dhicidda qotomiska iyo tallaallada ay carruurta tallaabo-baradka ahi qaadato oo caamka ah sida tallaalka cagaarshowga, booliyada, iyo cudurrada kale ee caabuqa leh.

Iyadoo ay beesha caafimaadku waxba-kama-jiraan ka soo qaadayso sheegashooyinkaas oo ayna soo jeedinayso in la isticmaalo dawooyin si loo bartilmaameedsado astaamaha qotomiska, hadana tusaalooyin tiro badan oo nool ayaa muujiyey aqbalidda dariiq nololeed oo caafimaad leh, dabiicina ah oo ku salaysan cunto cayriin oo loola gol leeyahay in lagu xoojiyo nuxurka ubucda, ay caawinayso adkaysiga habdhiska jirkana ay suntan ka saarayso, oo ka hor tegayso mararka qaarna xitaa ay caabbinayso qotomiska waqtigiisa billowga ah.

### Summer is Great Time to Learn

## Xagaagu waa Xilli Ku Haboon Waxbarasho

Columbus City Schools (CCS) is preparing a wide array of summer school enrichment programs for students who attended kindergarten through grade 12 during 2010-2011 school year.

At the elementary level, class work will focus on bringing students to higher academic achievement levels in reading and math. At the secondary level, the Summer Bridge program is designed to help ease the students' academic transitions to the high school. The high school Virtual Credit Advancement Program is designed to help students earn high school credits. In addition, the CCS summer program will host a Summer OGT Institute, a highly successful intervention initiative that further prepares pupils for the June administration of the Ohio Graduation Test.

The summer program dates vary as follows: The elementary and middle school-level programs begin the week of June 13 through July 7, Monday through Thursday. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade Summer Bridge Program begins June 13 through July 14. High School Summer School begins the week of June 13 through July 22. The OGT Institute begins the week of June 13 through June 17 in preparation for OGT testing the week of June 20. Students wanting to take the OGT in June must receive 10 hours of tutoring in the subject they wish to test and can do so at the Summer Institute.

Registration materials are available for pickup at the student's school as well as at the Summer School Office located at the Northgate Center. Registration packets may also be accessed through the CCS website, www.columbus.k12.oh.us. Select "Parents & Students" and follow the links.

Elementary, middle school, Summer Bridge and Summer OGT Institute courses are available free of charge to students enrolled with CCS. High School Summer School costs \$100, with the exception of Phys. Ed., which is \$50. Out-of-district tuition is \$300 or \$150 for Phys. Ed.
