CelebrateOne, United Health Foundation oo Ballaarinaya Barnaamij lagu Dhimayo Tirada Dhimashada Dhallaanka

Waaxda Caafimaadka Columbus, oo taageeraysa CelebrateOne, ayaa shaqaalaysiinaysa 72 shaqaalaha caafimaadka bulshada ah oo xiriir la samayn doona haweenka xilliga dhalmada ku jira si hoos loogu dhigo dhimashada dhallaanka ee siddeed xaafadood. Deeq dhan \$1.7 milyan ayay barnaamijka ugu ku bixisay mu'asasada United Health Foundation. SomaliCAN ayaa soo xuli doonta afar ka mid ah shaqaalaha bulshada caafimaadka oo u adeegi doona jaaliyadaha laga tirade badanyahay sida Soomaalida iyo Nepali-ga.

Deeqda ayaa gacan ka geysan doonta sidii wax looga qaban lahaa dhibaatooyinka caafimaadka dadweynaha Ohio. Sida ay muujinayso warbixinta United Health Foundation ee heerarka caafimaadka Maraykanka, Ohio ayaa gashay kaalinta 44 dhanka dhimashada dhallaanka dalka iyada oo in ka badan toddobo ka mid ah kunkii dhallaan ahba ay dhintaan inta aanay hal sano gaarin.

“CelebrateOne waxaa ka go’an in hantida ugu wanaagsan ee bulshadeennu u hibayn karto dhallaan walba ay tahay in la dhowro caafimaadka dhallaanka sannadka ugu horreeya nolosha si waddada loogu xaaro nolol caafimaad leh sannadaha dambe oo dhan,” ayay tir Liane Egle, madaxa CelebrateOne.

“Deeqda United Health Foundation waxay lama huraan u tahay bulshada sababta oo ah tababbarka iyo xirfadda ay kororsadaan shaqaalaha caafimaadka ayaa ku nagaanaya bulshada saamayn wanaagsanna ku yeelan doona qoysaska lala shaqeeyo.”

CelebrateOne waa hindise lagu dhexgelayo bulshada oo ay hormuud ka tahay waaxda caafimaadka Columbus iyo Guddiga Guud ee Dhallaanka Columbus si hoos loogu dhigo dhimashada dhallaanka illaa 40% isla markaasna kala bar loo dhimo kala farqiga isirka ku salaysan ee xaaladda caafimaad marka la gaaro sannadka 2020.

Ujeeddadu waa in shaqaalaha caafimaadka bulshada ee barnaamijka ka shaqaynaya ay sannad walba la xiriiraan 27,000 haween ah oo ku kala dhaqan xaafadaha Linden, Koonfurta, Bariga, Hilltop, Franklinton, Morse iyo 161-ka, Waqooyi Bari iyo Koonfur Bari.

Shaqaalaha caafimaadka bulshada waxaa la siin doonaa aqoon kororsi mushaarkiisa ay bixinayso CelebrateOne waxayna la shaqayn doonaan xaafadaha loo asteeyay ee Columbus.

Marka la isku daro, siddeeddan xaafadood waa meelaha ugu badan ee dhallaanku ku le'daan iyada oo 42% dhimashada dhallaanka ah halka ay ku dhashaan keliya 29 boqolkiiba carruurta degmada Franklin ku dhalata.

“U dabbaalgegga sannad jirsashadu waa tallaabo muhiim ah, waana mid si gaar ah bulshadeenna ahmiyad ugu leh,” ayuu yiri Duqa Magaalada Columbus Andrew Ginther.

“Waxaan uga mahad celinayaa United Health Foundation iskaashiga keenay in CelebrateOne ay xiriir la samayso haween fara badan kuna xiriiriso daryeel caafimaad oo leh ka hortagga, uurreyda, iyo ilmaha ee lama huraanka u ah dhimashada dhallaanka ee ku baahsan Columbus.

“Wada shaqaynta caynkan ah ee ku salaysan hindise bulsho oo casri ah ayaa muhiim u ah sare u qaadidda caafimaadka bulshada dalka oo dhan, iyo gaar ahaan halkan Columbus.” waxaa sidaas tiri Tracy Davidson oo ah Madaxa United Healthcare Community Plan of Ohio.

“In lagu xiriiriyo hooyooyinka iyo haweenka uurka leh shaqaale xirfad u leh caafimaadka bulshada oo deris la ah iyo adeegyo noloshooda wax ka baddela waxay suurta gelinaysaa in hooyooyinkan iyo dhallaankoodu ay caafimaad ku noolaadaan.”

“Waxaan jeclaan lahaa in aan uga mahad celiyo United Health Foundation iyo CelebrateOne shaqada ay ku taageerayaan hooyooyinka uurka leh iyo dhallaankaba sidii ay u heli lahaayeen adeegyo iyo daryeelka ay baahida u qabaan.

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Aniga oo aabbe u ah afar gabdhood, waxaan ku faraxsanahay dedaalka lagu daryeelayo bulshada si loo kobciyo caafimaadka dhallaanka iyo qoyska,” ayuu yiri Congressman Pat Tineri (R-OH). “Iskaashiga ka dhexeeya waaxda caafimaadka Columbus iyo United Health Foundation waa nooca wada shaqaynta loo baahanyahay si loo xalliyo dhibaatooyinka caafimaadka ee ugu adag,” ayuu yiri Congressman Steve Stivers (R-OH). “Marka la isu xilqaamo hindisiyaal sida CelebrateOne u wanaagsan, waxaa iskaashiga dowladda iyo shirkadaha gaarka loo leeyahay ka dhexeeya ka faa’iidaysanaya bulshada oo caafimaad wanaagsan ku naalloon doonta hantideenna ugu qiimaha badan oo awlaadda ahna caafimaadkooda dhawri doonta.”

Tirakoobka waaxda caafimaadka Columbus ayaa muujinaya in degmada Franklin oo keliya ay qiyaastii 150 dhallaan ahi ku saqiiraan sannad walba iyaga oo aan gaarin hal sano jir. CelebrateOne oo kaashanaysa United Health Foundation ayaa diyaarin doonta shaqaale xiriiriya bulshada oo ujeeddoodu tahay in la kordhiyo tirada haweenka da’da dhalnada ku jira ee xiriirka la leh adeegyada caafimaad iyo bulsho ee ka jira xaafadahooda iyo bulshada ay ku dhex noolyihiin. CelebrateOne, United Health Foundation to Expand Program Focused on Reducing Infant Mortality Rates -

Columbus Public Health, in support of CelebrateOne, will add 72 new community health workers to conduct outreach to women of childbearing age to help reduce infant mortality in eight Columbus communities, funded by a \$1.7 million partnership grant from United Health Foundation. SomaliCAN will recruit four community connectors from underserved communities including the Somali and Bhutanese/Nepali communities.

The grant will help address a critical public health need in Ohio. According to United Health Foundation’s America’s Health Rankings®, Ohio ranks 44th in the nation in infant mortality, with more than seven infant deaths before the age of one for every 1,000 live births. “CelebrateOne is committed to the idea that the greatest gift our community can give each baby is a healthy and safe first year of life, setting him or her on a path to thrive each year beyond that,” said Liane Egle, director, CelebrateOne. “This grant from United Health Foundation is critical because the training and community building will have lasting and positive effects on these families the program reaches.”

Collaboration Will Bolster Community-based Caregivers to Engage Moms and Moms-to-Be

CelebrateOne is a community-engagement initiative led by Columbus Public Health and the Greater Columbus Mortality Task Force to reduce infant mortality by 40 percent and halve the racial health disparity gap by 2020.

United Health Foundation’s grant over the next three years will enable 72 Community Health Workers to receive training, helping expand the number of community-based caregivers that are able to conduct outreach, build trust, and reduce barriers to care to help reduce the risk for increased rates of chronic morbidity and infant mortality.

The goal is for the trained Community Health Workers to reach 27,000 women each year through the program in the Columbus communities of Linden, Near South Side, Near East Side, Hilltop, Franklinton, Morse Rd-161, the Northeast and Southeast. The Community Health Workers will receive paid internships with CelebrateOne and work in the targeted Columbus communities.

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Combined, these eight communities account for 42 percent of all Franklin County infant deaths, but make up only 29 percent of all Franklin County births.

“Celebrating a baby’s first birthday is always a meaningful milestone, and in our community it is an especially critical one,” said Columbus Mayor Andrew Ginther.

“Thanks to partners like United Health Foundation, CelebrateOne is reaching out and connecting more women with preventive, prenatal and well-baby care, which is essential to ending the infant mortality epidemic Columbus faces.”

“These types of collaborative, innovative community-based initiatives are important to improving health outcomes in communities across the nation, including right here in Columbus,” said Tracy Davidson, CEO, UnitedHealthcare Community Plan of Ohio.

“Connecting moms and moms-to-be with trained health workers in their communities and resources that can make a difference in their lives will help these babies and their moms live healthier lives.”

“I would like to thank United Health Foundation and CelebrateOne for their work to help moms, expectant mothers and infants access the resources and care they need.

As a father of four daughters, I am grateful for their efforts to help our community thrive with healthier babies and stronger families,” said Congressman Pat Tiberi (R-OH).

Tackling a Serious Public Health Crisis at the Local Level

With Ohio having one of the highest rates of infant mortality in the nation, taking steps to address this public health crisis is critical to improving people’s health in Columbus.

Columbus Public Health statistics show that in Franklin County alone, approximately 150 babies die each year before reaching the age of one. CelebrateOne, in collaboration with United Health Foundation, will bolster the Community Connector Corp, which seeks to increase the number of women of childbearing age connected to health and social support within their communities and social networks.

The program has engaged thousands of women and families at health fairs, churches, community centers, civic meetings and support groups.

Lillie Banner, who is part of the Community Connector Corp in the South Side, Reeb-Hosack neighborhood of Columbus, said: “This type of program will have a lasting impact as we reach out to families door to door, face to face and within their neighborhoods. The response we’ve seen from participants is overwhelmingly positive and life-changing.

This collaboration with United Health Foundation will mean even more women and their babies will be stronger, healthier and happier.”

The grant was announced at a community birthday party and educational resource fair at the Reeb Avenue Center where Mayor Ginther joined community leaders, including John McCarthy, director Ohio Department of Medicaid, Teresa Long, Columbus Public Health commissioner, Priscilla Tyson, president pro tem, Columbus City Council, John O’Grady, president, Franklin County Board of Commissioners,

State Sen. Jim Hughes, State Representatives Hearcel Craig, Cheryl Grossman and Dave Leland, Sue Wolf, community leader, and current and former CelebrateOne participants, project partners and families to celebrate the first year of the program, its early success and the new funding to expand the program’s reach. Several project partners were recognized for their ongoing support for the program, including the Ohio State University College of Nursing, Community Development for All People, Men 4 the Movement, J. Jireh Ministries, Partner for Achieving Community Transformation (PACT), The Neighborhood House, St. Stephen’s Community House, Gladden Community House, YMCA, Somalican, Central Ohio Workforce Investment Corporation and Columbus Neighborhood Pride Centers.
